

PARTY CONSTITUTION

ONE NATION PARTY



Article I: Name

The name of the Party shall be "ONE NATION PARTY" (hereinafter referred to as "The Party").

Article II: Objective of the One Nation Party

The One Nation Party is dedicated to building a sovereign, self-reliant India (Aatmanirbhar Bharat) that draws its strength from its civilizational roots. Our primary objective is to achieve total economic autonomy by revitalizing local industries, MSMEs, and rural economies through the 'Vocal for Local' mission. We pledge to reform national systems by integrating the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) into education and policy, ensuring modern progress aligns with our cultural ethos. By prioritizing indigenous innovation, sustainable traditional agriculture, and holistic wellness, the Party aims to eliminate foreign dependencies, restoring India as a proud, self-sufficient global leader (Vishwaguru)

Article III: Ideological Pillars

Section I: Dharma-Guided Governance: Unlike Western secularism, our ideology is rooted in Dharma (righteousness and duty). We believe governance should protect the moral and cultural fabric of society while ensuring justice and equality for all citizens.

Section II: Artha Shastra (Economic Self-Reliance): We advocate for a Social Market Economy. This means supporting free-market competition, entrepreneurship, and private investment while maintaining a strong "nation-first" approach to protect domestic industries and achieve strategic autonomy.

Section III: Cultural Nationalism: Our identity is not just geographical but civilisational. We view India as an "Ancient Nation with a Modern State," where progress is only meaningful if it preserves our traditional values, family structures, and indigenous knowledge.

Section IV: Subsidiarity and Localism: We believe power should reside as close to the citizens as possible. We support empowering local communities, Panchayats, and MSMEs, reducing the overbearing influence of centralized bureaucracy in everyday life.

Pragmatic Reform: As a centric-right party, we believe in Gradualism. We reject "revolution" in favor of evolutionary change that amends the worst of our systems while keeping the best of our heritage intact.

Article IV: Membership Eligibility & Qualifications

Section I: Membership is open to any individual who fulfills the following conditions:

Section II: Citizenship & Age: Must be a citizen of India as defined under Articles 5 to 11 of the Constitution and have attained the age of 18 years (Universal Adult Suffrage).

Section III: Constitutional Allegiance: Must bear true faith and allegiance to the Constitution of India as established by law, and to the principles of Socialism, Secularism, and Democracy as mandated by Section 29A (5) of the Representation of the People Act, 1951.

Section IV: Sovereignty & Integrity: Must pledge to uphold the sovereignty, unity, and integrity of India, reflecting the Fundamental Duties enshrined in Article 51A.

Section V: Non-Dual Membership: Must not be a member of any other registered political party or any organization whose ideology conflicts with the national interest.

Section VI: Criminal Record: Must not have been convicted of any offense involving moral turpitude or any electoral malpractice under the Representation of the People Act.

Section VII: Equality of Opportunity: Membership shall be granted without discrimination based on religion, race, caste, sex, or place of birth, upholding Articles 14 and 15.

Section VIII: Commitment to Culture: Must pledge to protect and improve the national heritage and "composite culture" of India as per Article 51A(f).

Section IX: Financial Commitment: Regular payment of a prescribed annual membership fee of ₹100.

Section X: Residency: Enrolment is typically restricted to one's place of permanent residence or usual vocation

Section XI: Educational background: Member must be literated

Article V: Categories of Membership

The Party shall consist of the following two categories of members:

SECTION 1. Primary Member

Definition: Any citizen of India aged 18 or above who accepts the Party's constitution and pays the prescribed membership fee .

Rights:

Can participate in public rallies and local party meetings.

Has no voting rights in internal organizational elections.

SECTION 2. Active Member

Definition: A Primary Member who has been on the party rolls for 6 months and remains active in party work.

Criteria for Eligibility:

Must enroll 5 new Primary Members .

Must pay an "Active Member" fee or subscription.

Must not have been subject to any disciplinary action.

Rights:

Holds the right to vote in all internal party elections.

Is eligible to contest for positions within the Party Executive Committees (District, State, or National levels).

Article VI: Cessation of Membership

Membership ends automatically under these conditions:

Death: Upon the demise of the member. Resignation: Upon written submission to the Party.

Non-Renewal: Failure to pay dues or renew membership within 6 months.

Dual Membership: Joining or supporting another political party.

Expulsion: Due to "Anti-Party" activities or a criminal conviction. Election
Conflict: Contesting an election against an official Party candidate

Article VII: Term of Membership and Committees

Section 1: Term of Membership

Primary Membership: The term for Primary Membership shall ordinarily be 1 year. Members must renew their status by paying the prescribed fee before the expiry of this period to remain on the party's rolls.

Active Membership: The term for Active Membership shall also be 3 years. Renewal is subject to the member continuing to fulfill the eligibility criteria defined in Article V.

Section 2: Term of Office Bearers and Committees

Duration: The term of every Party Committee (at the Local, District, State, and National levels) and its elected Office Bearers (President, Secretary, etc.) shall ordinarily be 3 years.

Continuity: An existing committee or office bearer shall continue to function beyond the 3-year term until a new committee is duly elected or appointed, provided the delay does not exceed six months.

Section 3: Term Limits

To promote internal democracy, no member shall hold the same office-bearer position for more than three consecutive terms.

Section 4: Casual Vacancies

Any vacancy caused by resignation, death, or removal shall be filled for the remainder of the term through appointment by the higher committee or by-election.

Article VIII: Disciplinary Action

To maintain party integrity, the following process applies to any member violating the constitution:

SECTION 1. Grounds for Action

Action may be taken for "Anti-Party Activities," including:

Publicly criticizing Party policies or leadership.
Violating the Party Code of Conduct.
Misusing Party funds or resources.

SECTION 2. The Process

Show Cause Notice: The accused member is issued a written notice explaining the charges and given 15 days to respond.

Suspension: Pending an inquiry, the member may be suspended from all Party posts immediately.

Hearing: The Disciplinary Committee reviews the response and may call for a personal hearing.

SECTION 3. Penalties

Depending on the severity, the Committee may:

Issue a formal Warning.

Remove the member from their official post.

Expel the member for 4 years.

SECTION 4. Right to Appeal

Any disciplined member has the right to appeal the decision to the Higher Committee (e.g., State or National Executive) within 30 days

Article IX: Party Organs

The Party shall function through a hierarchical structure to ensure grassroots representation and national coordination:

SECTION 1. Local Level (Primary Unit)

The Unit Committee: Formed at the village or ward level.

Role: Grassroots outreach, membership drives, and local grievance redressal.

SECTION 2. District Level (District Executive)

The District Committee: Comprises elected representatives from the Local Units.

Role: Coordinating local units, managing district campaigns, and supervising regional party activities.

SECTION 3. State Level (State Executive)

The State Committee: The highest decision-making body in a State, led by the State

President.

Role: Formulating state-specific policies, selecting candidates for State Assembly elections, and organizing state rallies.

SECTION 4. National Level (National Executive)

The National Committee: The supreme governing body of the Party, led by the National President.

Role: Final authority on Party ideology, National Manifesto, alliances with other parties, and selection of Parliamentary candidates.

SECTION 5. The Working Committee

A smaller, high-powered group selected from the National Executive to handle urgent day-to-day decisions and administrative matters.

Article X: Office Bearers (Level-Wise)

The Party shall have a standardized hierarchy of office bearers across all levels of the organization to ensure clear administration and accountability.

SECTION 1. National Level (All India)

The supreme leadership team is responsible for the Party's national strategy and policies.

National President: The highest executive authority of the Party.

National Vice-Presidents: To assist the President and act in their absence.

National General Secretaries: Chief administrative heads for national operations.

National Treasurers: Custodians of the Party's national accounts and funds.

National Secretaries: Assigned to specific departments or states to assist General Secretaries.

SECTION 2. State Level

Responsible for the Party's affairs within a specific state or union territory.

State President: Leads the state unit and reports to the National President.

State Vice-Presidents: Support the State President.

State General Secretaries: Manage state-level administration and coordination.

State Treasurers: Maintain the state unit's financial accounts.

State Secretaries: Oversee specific portfolios like media, youth, or women's wings at the state level.

SECTION 3. District Level

The primary coordinating body for local units within a district.

District President: The administrative head of the district unit.

District Vice-Presidents: Assist in district-wide management.

District General Secretary: Handles day-to-day administrative tasks for the district.

District Secretaries & Treasurer: Manage specific district activities and local funds.

SECTION 4. Block Constituency Level (Intermediate)

Acts as a bridge between the district and grassroots village units.

Block President (or Coordinator): Manages party activities in a specific legislative constituency.

Block Vice-President & Secretary: Assist in local coordination and member mobilization.

SECTION 5. Local/Primary Level (Village or Ward)

The most fundamental unit of the Party, operating at the ground level.

Village/Ward President: Leads the local party committee.

Village/Ward Vice-President: Assists the local president.

Village/Ward Secretary: Responsible for local membership registers and meeting records.
